

**RESOLUTION OF THE SUMMIT LAKE PAIUTE COUNCIL

RESOLUTION NO.: SL - 04 - 2013

TITLE: Adoption of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) as the Tribal organizational system for future Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management.

WHEREAS, the Summit Lake Paiute Tribe is organized pursuant to Section 16 of Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) as amended, with the Articles of Association, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 08, 1965, granting certain rights of home rule to the Summit Lake Paiute Council, and a responsibility for the general welfare of its membership; and

WHEREAS, Homeland Security Presidential Directive/HSPD-5, dated February 28, 2003, established the National Incident Management System (NIMS); and,

WHEREAS, the NIMS establishes a single, comprehensive approach to domestic incident management to ensure that all levels of government across the Nation have the capability to work efficiently and effectively together using a national approach to domestic incident management; and

WHEREAS, the NIMS provides a consistent nationwide approach for Federal, State, Local, and Tribal governments to work together to prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents regardless of the cause, size, or complexity; and,

WHEREAS, the NIMS provides for interoperability and compatibility among Federal, State, Local, and Tribal capabilities and includes a core set of concepts, principles, terminology, and technologies covering the incident command system (ICS), unified command, training, management of resources, and reporting; and,

WHEREAS, beginning October 1, 2006, all Federal departments and agencies shall make adoption of the NIMS a requirement, to the extent provided by law, for providing Federal preparedness assistance through grants, contracts or other activities to local governments; and,

WHEREAS, beginning September 30, 2007, all Tribal, Local, and State entities must have adopted and implemented NIMS in order to receive Federal preparedness assistance through grants, contracts, or other activities to local governments.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Summit Lake Paiute Council hereby directs all Tribal Departments and Programs involved as first responders during a disaster or emergency incident to be trained in all aspects of NIMS and ICS to the extent that funding is available; and,

THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, the Summit Lake Paiute Council hereby adopts and ensures implementation of the National Incident Management System (NIMS) to prepare for and respond to disaster incidents from an all-hazards approach, to enhance the health and safety of tribal members, families, and visitors on the Summit Lake Paiute Reservation.
